We had a larger discussion about succession plans and also continuity of things like the St. Francis CYM social media/facebook page and ensuring that staff and committee members have access as people leave.

Parish Hall Rental

We discussed encouraging those who were having difficulty registering / renting to explore starting a ministry and to meet with Travis to have a discussion.

7 pm Mass

Most of us were supportive of the decision to discontinue this Mass. Fran mentioned that due to work schedules of emergency responders, some families might not have any other SFA Mass they can attend together. Ann suggested having a once-per-month 7 p.m. Saturday Mass to allow those parishioners to still have one Mass at their home parish that their families could attend together, while still lightening our Mass schedule most of the month. Another suggestion was to survey attendees about what they would do if this time was no longer offered.

Jeremy's Dad still plans to assist with the timeline project; he is just waiting for someone to reach out. We discussed/asked whether seminarians should be added to the timeline, but perhaps it would be better to just add priests/religious.

Jes reported that he believes we need better video streaming equipment and possibly should consider multistreaming on Facebook. Jes will send some notes on this topic to the council in more detail.

Jessie will review Google/Youtube analytics, and the team wonders if we might have to pay for more advanced analytics or if it is even going to be possible to tell where people are watching from, depending on what service they are using and if they are logged in. We discussed if it is important to know if it is flawed information; regardless we might try to see if we can gain any insight like geographic area, age groups watching. Pearl mini (our current equipment) is missing some major functions.

The council discussed briefly effectively meeting people in today's culture, evangelizing, possible alumni connections. We also discussed the importance of encountering Jesus at Mass and making connections.

Council wonders if "See ya at Mass" signage will be promoted at Stewardship Fair and/or Fun Night? Discussed ideas of parishioners handing out cards with candy at Halloween, listing times for Mass?

Mass Attendance Issue:

Communication council discussed this topic. We are limited in written communication, so we need to select effective, meaningful, relatable messages. Jessie spoke about how it might be easy for parishioners to disconnect, if they are not feeling that they are missed. We discussed possible avenues to connect with parishioners, for example at Stewardship renewal with personal meetings or inviting

I had a very interesting conversation with Alan Schuckman concerning the effectiveness of Newsletters. In his research, only 7% of a population of "donors" receive information via social media. According to this research, newsletters are still the more effective tool for communication. I would encourage someone to reach out to Alan and hear what he told me (as my memory is what it is ③)

Right now, content being shared via Flocknote has consisted of individual news items.

Discussed digital preservation of old Vernaculars, although this is not an urgent need. It would be beneficial to have archival quality versions of the content that is both safely saved and the material to be searchable. The project needs to just have enough volunteers and the materials will need to be scanned to high enough quality – at 300 dpi minimal. Jessie, Jeremy and Ann will meet and find volunteers for this project. The future benefit of this content will be to highlight previous stories and look back, especially with the search back function.

My take is "no harm, no foul." If the content is not a burden to the website, even if it is not frequently accessed, that is still a wonderful archival method. might express interest in being the editor.

Father J. told us about Alan Schuckman's research into effectiveness of newsletters. We would be interested in knowing if this was print newsletters specifically or does it also include email newsletters.

Childcare would be a critical piece if we could find a way to support and lessen the risk of teachers from leaving. Seek out parishioners to support this? Form a program that could utilize volunteers. Would something similar to mom's day out structure work?

We face unique situations with teachers leaving the diocese or leaving the profession – discernment. 3rd pregnancies tend to be when childcare can no longer be afforded.

None of the 10% parish tithe goes to fund catholic schools. Generate an endowment? Can pull off 4% to come off each year. Teacher salary endowment would provide and continue to build.

An idea for recruiting endowments - Knights of Columbus – use insurance policies and make the beneficiary to be SFA. Take out an insurance policy simply for the reason of leaving an endowment.

Strategic plan- Janet Eaton – work with us to build a strong strategic plan. The more input, the better the plan. 2022.10.13-14 - Throwin' the Flag


I think it's time to throw the flag. To be clear... I am NOT saying it's time to throw in the towel. Those are two entirely different sayings. With this letter, I am inviting you to help me address an urgent issue for the life of our parish. I am inviting you to do what the book of Hebrews, in the New Testament, refers to as "encouraging one another... to attend the assembly" (Heb 10:25). We, together as a parish, need to own this challenge that I am presenting to you with this letter.

Since 2020, after Bishop Kemme lifted the dispensation, our Mass attendance has not recovered to pre-COVID numbers (see below). For some, that may be because of valid medical or physical concerns. Such persons have reason to stay home.

For others, however, it is because they have thrown in the towel on Mass. Some persons, having lost the habit of Sunday Mass, have simply chosen not to return. Others, however, having developed the habit of watching Mass online, have chosen not to return to Mass in person; but, rather, have attempted to fulfill their obligation by watching online. Last year, after live stream started at SFA, we averaged 219 viewers. This year, however, we are currently at 383 viewers. Almost twice as many! I am concerned some have thrown in the towel of live participation at Mass. I am throwing the flag on that.

For those who are healthy, watching Mass online does not fulfill one's Sunday obligation. Would watching Hawaii on YouTube be a substitute for vacation? Neither should we avoid going to Mass. One does not get experience the peace or weather of Hawaii by watching it on the internet. In fact, watching such things on the internet would only make one



MORE excited to go to the places seen. Right? So, shouldn't it stand to reason, that watching Mass online, like seeing Disney or Hawaii make us WANT to go to Mass in person more?

Furthermore, I have heard some say, "At least watching Mass on TV is better than nothing." Really? I'm throwing a flag on that one too! I mean, is that true for eating steak? Remember, the Eucharist is the actual flesh of Jesus Christ. As he himself

said, "For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink" (John 6:55). In the same way you cannot eat steak via YouTube, you can't receive the flesh of Christ online.

I am especially concerned for the number of families with children in school or in PSR who are not maintaining their commitment to Sunday Mass. All of us, the entire parish, as "stewards of God's gifts" (1 Pet 4:10) have made the commitment to attend Sunday Mass as a living aspect of our discipleship to

l	the Lord. We must "encourage one another," as well as ourselves individually, to make good on this
	commitment. As we have seen our overall attendance has declined as a parish. This is true of subsections
-	of our parish as well, such as Catholic school families. For example, according to a 2019 survey of 10th –
	12th Catholic high school students, 72% self-reported that they attended Mass "very often". Yet in 2022
	that number dropped to 62%. And, yes, I am throwing a flag on that.

The Eucharistic presence of Christ is irreplaceable. It, and only it, is the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus Christ himself. Again, Christ said, "Where two or three are gathered in my name, there am I in the midst of them" (Matt 18:20). The community is itself an experience of the Body of Christ that cannot be experienced via live stream. For both of these reasons, we cannot allow ourselves to be content with

either missing Sunday Mass, nor watching Mass online (if we are healthy).

Friends, please take me seriously on this point! Jesus Christ suffered and died for us and gave us the ability to participate fully in his life, death, and resurrection in the Eucharist. This is an actual participation in the heavenly liturgy (Heb 12:22-24). So, as the book of Hebrews also says, "So Strengthen your drooping hands and your weak knees" (Heb 12:12-13), and "encourage one another" (Heb 10:25). As I said at the beginning of this letter, <u>we</u>, together as a parish, need to own this challenge.

Please, attend Sunday Mass, in person, every Sunday and Holy Day of Obligation.
